STUDENT EXPECTATIONS

- Students are expected to maintain 95% attendance while enrolled in the MyPath Program.
- Students are expected to participate in activities which hold them accountable to proposed project.
- Students are expected to participate in periodic check in meetings with district staff, as well as culminating semester presentations.
- A focused research topic may be required as part of Project Management Plans

 - b. ACTION PLAN SHALL INCLUDE: TOPICS TO BE COVERED, CURRICULAR STANDARDS ADDRESSED, GOALS, ACTIVITIES AND REFLECTION
- 2. A CULMINATING PRESENTATION SHALL OCCUR AT THE END OF THE SEMESTER/ PROJECT TIMELINE.

ACCOUNTABILITY ACTIVITIES

- 1. Students shall complete a weekly activity logs entry which consists of times, locations and activities and submit to Mentor Teacher through Google Classrom.
- 2. STUDENTS SHALL COMPLETE BI-WEEKLY REFLECTION JOURNALS ON MYPATH EXPERIENCES.
- 3. STUDENTS WILL SCHEDULE TIME TO MEET WITH THEIR TEACHER TO PROVIDE UPDATES.
